Mr. Roller says in his opinion they are worth around \$60,000. The amount of taxes due are small compared to the value. The commissioners plan to sell some of the lots. Those of you who are interested in buying some should see the commissioners. I also urge everyone of you to attend the commission meetings. It is your duty. They are held every first and third Tuesday.
