### **Biographical Note**

Harold Nathaniel Reddick (1913-2003), a native of Jacksonville, Florida, worked as a porter for the Pullman Sleeping Car Company, eventually becoming involved in the BSCP (Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters) for over 30 years. In 1939, Reddick moved to Tampa, where he served as vice-president of the Tampa NAACP in the mid-1940s. Reddick's involvement helped steer the Tampa NAACP on a path that would serve as a model throughout the following decade. Harold Reddick died on December 24, 2003.

This collection contains awards, correspondence, newspaper articles, interviews, and documents related to Harold Nathaniel Reddick's personal achievements, especially his involvement in the civil rights movement through the Tampa NAACP and the local chapter of the Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters Union.
